Last year, Asbury raised over \$140,000! According to Restore Hope records, 60 percent of all client households are "extremely low income" and well under the poverty line. Last year, Restore Hope gave over 163,000 lbs of food to over 4,500 families, kept 721 families from becoming homeless, and continue to give out more Bibles each year. 602 Bible were given out this year, which is an 80 percent increase over the past two years. Over half of those assisted by Restore Hope are children 18 years of age and under, 45 percent of those assisted with Restore Hope's food program are children in Oklahoma. One in five Oklahoma children is at risk of going to bed hungry.

Chris Cleveland and Stars Go Dim on the Road

I'm so excited to announce that I, along with my brother and some great friends are releasing a music project with Warner Brothers' Christian division, Word Entertainment, this October. I have been a worship leader at Asbury for eight years and the director of our modern music department leading our 11:00 am Sunday service for two years.

I started a band eight years ago—Stars Go Dim—the same month I started at Asbury. We signed a record deal with Warner Brothers the same month that I came on full time. These two parts of my life have lived and grown together, and it makes me feel like Asbury really is the beating heart of this project.

The opening song on the record is a song I wrote specifically for our 11:00 am service. It is a remake of the historic song, the Doxology. I wrote two more verses and a chorus that I believe capture the heart and story of Jesus and His message. We sing it regularly in our services. I can't express the feeling of knowing something that was created for the heart of Asbury will now have the ability to impact lives all over the world.

If there is anything of importance I would like you to know about this whole process it is this: This project is not simply me playing music; it is the very essence of Asbury going out into the world to effectively create significant change for Christ.

Our first single for this record will release to radio on July 10. It is called *You Are Loved*. It's such a timely message for our culture especially in the divisive times we seem to be living in at present moment. I encourage you to listen to the song and also call KXOJ, our local station, and let them know how much you enjoy hearing them play it.

We will release the full length album the end of October and follow that release by joining the largest tour in Christian music in the world, WinterJam.

As we continue to share the message of Christ and continue to pursue the heart of His people globally, locally and within our own walls, I ask that you continually pray that He can use all of us to advance His kingdom to continue to develop all generations for significant lives in Christ.
